Voluntary Water Use Restrictions

Borough Administrators and the Madison Water Department are asking all Madison residents and businesses to observe voluntary water use restrictions during the summer months. The use of water outdoors is permitted from 12:01 a.m. to 8 a.m. and then from 8 p.m. to 12 a.m. midnight on the designated days. Borough officials noted there should be no outdoor water use between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on any day.
