Dodge Field Basketball Courts

The Dodge Field Basketball Courts are now officially ready for play! Crack repair, resurfacing, and repainting were completed last week, marking the end of a two-year effort by the Recreation Department and the Madison Basketball Association (MBA) to renovate the courts. This process also included the installation of lighting, new rims and backboards, and padding for the poles and fencing.

The courts are open to the general public, but perhaps the most excited group is the Madison Basketball Association's Youth Summer League. Open to girls and boys, the league has been very popular since its inception in 2014, and that popularity--and the contributions of the MBA--helped spur the renovation efforts.

The cost of the resurfacing project was split evenly between the Borough and the MBA and serves as another example of a successful collaboration between the Department of Recreation and its many volunteers. Zach Ellis, the Director of Recreation, added "The continued cooperation and financial support of our sports volunteer organizations has again proven invaluable to improving our programs and facilities."
