FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

- 1. What is the No-Visit List?** The No-Visit List is similar to the State and Federal no-call list for telemarketers. The No-Visit list establishes residences within the Borough of Madison that are essentially "off-limits" to peddlers, solicitors and canvassers.
- 2. Can handbills or flyers be left on my door or property?** No. The Ordinance (139-16) specifically states that flyers and handbills cannot be placed or left upon any property listed on the Borough's No-Visit List.
- 3. If someone going door-to-door should I call the police?** No, probably not. If they are properly licensed (have completed an application and are wearing a according to their rights and court rulings up until 9pm unfortunately, as frustrating that is to many of us there is not much we can do, that is, unless your residence is on this "NO-Visit List". They would not at any time be able to come to your door and must abide to the town's No-Visit List. If they do not, you may indeed call the Madison Police Department to properly enforce.
