COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following is a recap from the Monday, May 14, 2018 Borough of Madison Council Meeting.

Council President Patrick Rowe filled in for Mayor Conley, and read two proclamations. The first was presented to the Madison Police Department in recognition of the hard work and dedication they give to protect the Borough as we celebrate National Police Week (May 13-19). The second proclamation was presented to Tri-Town 55+ Coalition for the celebration of their successful first year. A first year anniversary event will be held on Wednesday, May 23 from 1:30 to 2:30 P.M. at the Madison Area YMCA. More information can be found [here](#).

The Shade Tree Management Board was congratulated as Madison earned recognition as a Tree City USA, receiving a Growth Award by the Arbor Day Foundation.

During the meeting the Council unanimously voted to adjourn Ordinance 26-2018 until the next Council meeting on Wednesday, May 30, as the two council representatives on the Planning Board were not in attendance. Comments and discussion from the public were opened up for hearing on this ordinance, but none was heard during the public's invitation for discussion.

All of the Consent Agenda Resolutions (R151-2018 through R 172-2018) were approved by block vote from the Council.

29-2018 - Appropriating \$43,000.00 from the General Capital Improvement Fund for the purchase of a new pumper in the year 2020

30-2018 - Appropriating \$50,000.00 from the General Capital Improvement Fund for the purchase of a new vehicle

31-2018 - Appropriating \$100,000.00 from the General Capital Improvement Fund for the purchase of radio equipment

32-2018 - Appropriating \$125,000.00 from the Electrical Capital Improvement Fund to purchase primary voltage copper cable for the Kings Road feeder lines up to Green Village Road and for the Waverly Place upgrade

33-2018 - Appropriating \$200,000.00 from the Affordable Housing Trust Fund for the purchase of one half of a two family condominium unit at the Millennium Development
