### COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following is a recap from the Wednesday, May 30, 2018 Borough of Madison Council Meeting.

Mayor Conley, swore in Patrolman Kyle L. McDermott, the 156th Madison Police Officer appointed since 1890. Proclamations were presented for the Madison Young Writers Month and Gun Violence Awareness Day. In addition, students from Central Avenue School presented on their Green Day Kleen Kanteen initiative.

JCP&L executive Robert Walton was in attendance to thank the Madison Electric Department for assisting them during the recent storms. There was a discussion about the upcoming tree trimming that will take place along the New Jersey Transit railroad tracks.

Borough Administrator, Raymond M. Codey talked about the Salt Charitable Contribution Law, and Ordinance 36-2018 regarding Street Opening Permits.

A long discussion regarding land use Ordinance 26-2018 took place, including comments and questions from many members of the public before it was voted on by the council.

All of the Consent Agenda Resolutions (R 173-2018 through R 180-2018) were unanimously approved by the Council.

**29-2018** - Appropriating \$43,000.00 from the General Capital Improvement Fund for the purchase of a new pumper in the year 2020

**30-2018** - Appropriating \$50,000.00 from the General Capital Improvement Fund for the purchase of a new vehicle

**31-2018** - Appropriating \$100,000.00 from the General Capital Improvement Fund for the purchase of radio equipment

**32-2018** - Appropriating \$125,000.00 from the Electrical Capital Improvement Fund to purchase primary voltage copper cable for the Kings Road feeder lines up to Green Village Road and for the Waverly Place upgrade

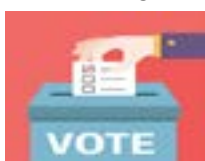
