COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following is a recap from the Monday, June 26, 2018 Borough of Madison Council Meeting.

Council President Patrick Rowe filled in for Mayor Conley. During his greeting to the public there was a moment of silence for the passing of former Firefighter Stanley Godlewski and Mayor Conley's father Arthur.

A discussion regarding Resolutions 198-2018 and 199-2018, both pertaining to the 2017 audit was held. CFO/Assistant Borough Administrator Jim Burnet talked briefly about the audit, explaining that there are no real worries that came up. You can review the entire 2017 audit [here](#).

During new business, the Council voted unanimously to appoint Scott Spelker as Town Historian for Madison.

Consent Agenda Resolutions R195-2018 through R201-2018, R203-2018 and R204-2018 were approved by unanimous vote.

At the July 9th Council meeting there will be a presentation on mPay2Park mobile parking payment and enforcement system and an update on implementation of the recent Urbanomics Revitalization study.

IF YOU WON'T BE HOME...
on 90+ degree days, set the temperature **5 degrees higher** before you leave.
