### COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following is a recap from the Wednesday, September 12, 2018 Borough of Madison Council Meeting.

Three Auxiliary Police Officers were sworn in:

**Samuel DeMarzo** – Serving on the Auxiliary Police since 1978, was sworn in as Chief;

**Pasquale (Pat) Spagnuolo** – Serving on the Auxiliary Police since the 1970s, was sworn in as Captain.

**Samuel J. DeMarzo Jr.** – Serving on the Auxiliary Police since 2006, was sworn in as Lieutenant.

Mayor Conley presented the Hero Award to three Madison Police Officers, Sergeant James Cavezza, Officer Christopher Burans and Officer Travis Daniel, for their assistance along with Chatham Police Officers to safely remove a juvenile threatening to jump off a railroad bridge.

A proclamation was presented to Chatham Borough Council President Len Resto supporting the third annual “Out of the Darkness” walk on September 22, 2018 at 4:30pm at Cougar Field in Chatham to increase awareness of suicide prevention and to raise funds for the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention.
